

What are the risks and what could I get in return?

Under extreme market conditions you may not be able to cash in early, and you may have to pay significant extra costs to cash in early. It is a product to be entered into for its term that cannot be easily sold. Early termination may occur (i) if certain events of default or other termination events occur or (ii) at the sole discretion of DSK Bank AD, in which case early termination payments may apply. Early exit impact: If the product is terminated early, in whole or in part, an Early Termination Payment may become payable by either you or DSK Bank AD. The Early Termination Payment is linked to market parameters and could be a substantial loss or gain to you. Settlement on early termination will be specific to your Commodity Swap and will be influenced by a number of factors which include but are not limited to: whether it is an increasing or decreasing commodity environment; the movement of the commodity price since the trade date; the amount affected by the early termination.

The Early Termination Payment amount represents the economic value of what DSK Bank AD would have paid or received if the product continued as agreed. Depending on market conditions at the time of the early termination, the settlement calculated could result in a substantial amount being due from you to DSK Bank AD.
